




CAPTAIN Training - What is Autism







PENT - Essential 10

This training is intended for school staff who are involved in the creation of Behavioral Intervention Plans. The Essential 10: Essential **Components of Behavior Intervention Plans** (BIPs) was developed by PENT to support educators in writing behavior intervention plans which are rooted in the science of behavior analysis, contain elements which are shown through research to be best practice, and to satisfy legal requirements of a behavior intervention plan. The training provides an overview of this tool, which is intended to guide those developing BIPs, by providing a rubric to score plans and identify areas of weakness which could lead to an ineffective plan.

CRISIS PREVENTION INSTITUTE- CPI





Crisis Prevention Institute-CPI

CPI is an evidence-based program that focuses on the care, welfare, safety, and security of students and staff. This curriculum provides strategies to prevent escalating behaviors to intervene and de-escalate risk behaviors, and to reduce or eliminate the use of restraints.

During the classroom session, participants will receive the CPI Non-violent Crisis Intervention booklet for on-the-job reference information. Participants will learn and safely practice any applicable physical disengagement and/or hold skills. Participants will be forwarded a CPI card upon passing post-test and completing the participant evaluation on the day of the training.

WESELPA will now offer CPI's Refresher Training. This streamlined program is designed to efficiently update previously trained staff with effective techniques, while also offering optional advanced topics for those looking to enhance their knowledge further.

BRIDGE AUTHORIZATION CERTIFICATION




Early Childhood Educator

The Bridge Authorization is an added authorization for special education credential holders whose credential was issued prior to the new standards and is intended to result in these credential holders having authorizations that are equivalent in scope to the new Early Childhood Special Education (authorization code ECES).









Mild/Moderate Supports Needs and Extensive Support Needs

The Bridge Authorization is an added authorization for special education credential holders whose credential was issued prior to the new standards and is intended to result in these credential holders having authorizations that are equivalent in scope to the new Mild to Moderate Support Needs (authorization code MMSN), and Extensive Support Needs (authorization code ESN) authorizations.



Intended Audience: Certificated Staff who hold an Education Specialist credential authorized in Mild/Moderate Disabilities or Moderate/Severe Disabilities or the equivalent
