Ian currently attends the University of Hawaii; the West End SELPA and Administrator shared their gratitude for sharing his story. No questions or comments were provided by committee members.

6. District/Agency Reports

Alta Loma representative shared the district has hired additional staff to conduct assessments over the summer; the district hired an additional 3 clinicians due to the influx of mental health evaluations; the district is currently utilizing Smart Social as a tool to help parents in regard to social media; the district will be opening a new preschool gen ed/sped program due to an increase in enrollment; the district will be holding their Special Education Symposium on January 23rd; and the district has added three teacher on assignments (technology, reading, math).

Chino Valley representative shared Chino Valley's new Special Education Director, Cheli McReynolds. The district is partnering with the Family Engagement Center to provide workshops. The series of workshops provided will ensure parents are connected to the school and their students.

Mt. Baldy representative shared that parent volunteers and additional aids have been added to classrooms; middle school teachers are providing social-emotional learning every day; the district will provide an enrichment program that will commence January 2023 and will provide socialization for all students; the district currently offers the Care Solstice program that provides mental health and counseling services outside of the school as an additional resource for mental health needs.

Community Advisory Committee **Representatives**

Community Advisory Committee representatives serve an important role as a liaison between the community and the district director of special education. Representatives recommend priorities for special education services, assist in parent education, and support activities on behalf of individuals with exceptional needs.

In accordance with the Community Advisory Committee bylaws, the **Chaffey JUHSD, Chino Valley USD, Etiwanda SD, and Upland USD** school districts shall appoint parent representatives in odd-numbered years to the Community Advisory Committee for a two-year term, beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The representative should be a parent of a student residing and enrolled in the school district or a district-offered school program. The appointment is by the action of the District Board of Education.

Once the School District Board of Education has approved the appointment of the district representative, please forward the name, and contact information for the representative to Natalie Vivar, Administrative Assistant, West End SELPA.

2023/24 Annual Budget and Service Plans

Background:

California Education Code (EC) Section 56205 requires the submission of Annual Budget and Service Plans adopted at public hearings held by the SELPA. Each SELPA is required to submit an Annual Budget Plan and an Annual Service Plan by June 30th of each year.

The Annual Budget Plan identifies projected revenues and expenditures for students with disabilities. These projections are identified at the SELPA level and for each participating LEA using CDE-adopted templates.

The Annual Service Plan identifies a full continuum of service options provided within the SELPA, assuring access to appropriate instruction and services for all students with disabilities from birth to twenty-two years of age, including children with low-incidence disabilities.

Whereas, the administrative entity for single LEA SELPA is identified as a responsible individual.
